



Sandygate Halls

Sandygate has 136 en-suite bedrooms, within 29 flats. Most flats have 4 or 5 bedrooms.

All bedrooms are modern and of a good size, featuring a small double bed, notice boards, study desk and chair, chest of drawers, wardrobe and a waste bin. Each en-suite has a personal shower, wash basin and toilet.

Each flat has a communal kitchen, which is well-equipped with a dining table and chairs, cooker, fridges, freezers, microwave, kettle, toaster, and plenty of cupboard space.

There is a student hub social area, which features flexible working space and comfortable seating and a flat screen TV.

We also have a cinema room which is perfect for flat movie nights!
